

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

ADELAIDE GUITAR FESTIVAL'S WINTER SCHOOL

1. What is the Adelaide Guitar Festival's Winter School (AGFWS)?

The Adelaide Guitar Festival's Winter School are week-long guitar intensives, held during the July, which provide an opportunity for participants to learn from some of Australia's finest guitarists in a small, immersive, guitar playing and skills development intensive. The Adelaide Guitar Festival Winter School is held in two streams:

1. **'Adelaide Guitar Festival Orchestra (AGFO)'** – focusing on classical guitar playing and ensemble techniques
2. **'Blues and Roots'** – incorporating acoustic guitar playing, traversing a range of roots and blues techniques.

AGFWS is open to all ages and participants are invited to register for their preferred stream at www.adelaideguitarfestival.com.au

2. Key Dates

- Registrations open: Wednesday 19 January, 2022
- Registrations close: Wednesday 15 June 2022 (or earlier if all spaces are filled)
- Blues and Roots Winter School: Monday 11 – Friday 15 July 2022, 9am – 3.30pm daily
- Blues and Roots Performance: Saturday 16 July 2022, 12:30pm – 3pm (TBC)
- AGFO Winter School: Monday 18 – Friday 22 July 2022, 9am – 4pm daily
- AGFO Performance: Friday 22 July 2022, 7pm

3. Registrations

Registrations open on Wednesday 19 January 2022 and close on Wednesday 15 June 2022 or earlier if all spaces are filled.

All bookings are to be made online at www.adelaideguitarfestival.com.au

Numbers are strictly limited so we encourage you to book early.

4. Cost

The program cost is \$250.00 per participant, per program stream, for the full 5 days and must be paid in full by Wednesday 15 June 2022. Participants must attend for the full 5 days. Individual day bookings are not permitted. All transactions incur an \$8.95 Ticketek transaction fee, if booking for multiple participants we encourage you to book them all in a single transaction.

Limited centrED equity subsidies are available to primary and secondary students who otherwise may not be able to attend due to financial hardship or distance. Please note that funding is limited and will be approved on a case-by-case basis until exhausted.

5. Eligibility

There are different skill-level and age group requirements for the two streams. Participants in both streams are required to bring their own instruments:

a) Adelaide Guitar Festival Orchestra (AGFO)

The AGFO stream is aimed at participants who have some classical guitar playing experience and can play at equivalent to **AMEB Grade 3 level** or higher and have a good understanding of the fingerboard. Guitarists of all ages are welcome to register provided they meet the minimum AMEB level. Participants will join one of three sectionals to create the Adelaide Guitar Festival Orchestra.

b) Blues & Roots

This stream is aimed at players from beginner to intermediate level, **aged 14 and older** and will include both playing and songwriting techniques. Participants will create their own songs in a group/band setting with special guest tutors.

7. Schedule

The Blues and Roots Winter School runs from Monday 11 July to Friday 15 July 2022 inclusive.

Each session will run from 9am – 3:30pm daily.

The performance on the Saturday 16 July between 12:30pm – 3pm at The Governor Hindmarsh will require performers to be on site prior to 11am.

Exact performance schedule to be sent to all participants in May 2022

The Classical Winter School runs from Monday 18 July – Friday 22 July 2022 inclusive.

Each session will run from 9am – 3:30pm daily.

8. Transport

- All participants over 18 years must arrange their own transport to and from the Winter School venues
- Participants aged 15 – 17 will need signed permission from the guardian to arrive and depart alone
- Participants under 15 years must be delivered, collected, and signed in/out by a guardian unless otherwise negotiated with Adelaide Guitar Festival

9. Meals

NO meals or snacks are provided. Participants must bring their own snacks and lunch and water.

Please note participants aged 15 or younger will not be permitted to leave the Adelaide Festival Centre Premises during lunch breaks and must bring their own lunch rather than expect to buy lunch. Unless negotiated with the Adelaide Guitar Festival

There are strictly no products containing nuts allowed.

10. Who are the tutors?

CLASSICAL TUTORS:

Dr. Paul Svoboda (Director) - Paul is an in-demand guitar ensemble specialist composer and teacher. Holding a Doctorate of Musical Arts from the Sibelius Academy of Music, 2021 marks his 7th year directing at the Adelaide Guitar Festival Winter School.

Giuseppe Zangari – Principle of the Sydney Guitar School, Giuseppe has a keen interest in developing young guitarists to realise their full potential through comprehensive instruction in a fun and enthusiastic learning environment.

Andras Tuske - completed his studies in 1993 at the Elder Conservatory of Music, University of Adelaide and has participated in masterclasses with John Williams, Maximo Pujol, David Tannanbaum, Carlo Barone, Tim Kain and Isolde Schaupp.

Manus Noble - Irish guitarist Manus Noble is one of the UK's leading classical guitarists, known for his strong, unique sound, original compositions and varied recital programmes that aim to break down audience's preconceptions of what is possible on the guitar.

BLUES & ROOTS TUTORS:

Cal Williams Jr (Director) - Multi-award winning Blues singer/songwriter, Cal combines the gentle fingerpicking of British Folk with the raw intensity of Delta Slide Blues to create a sound that is both intricate and powerful. This talent earned him a spot in the Top 3 Guitarists in Australia in the 2012 Derringers Blues Awards.

11. What to wear

Clean and comfortable clothing that is conducive to playing guitar.

12. What to bring

Classical Guitar Stream

- Clip-on tuner
- Footstool/thigh support
- Guitar (classical guitars are preferred, acoustic guitars permitted but must have nylon strings)

Blues & Roots Stream

- Tuner
- Guitar – acoustic only. No electric guitars. Steel strings welcome.
- Guitar strap

Everyone:

- Strings should be as new as possible
- Spare strings
- Pencil
- Water bottle
- Snacks
- Lunch

Please put your name on all your belongings including clothing, water bottles, guitar cases, and music

15. Adelaide Guitar Festival Performances

The culmination of the work created during the Winter School will be performed in a concert following the school. All participants are encouraged to participate. If the performance is presented within a ticketed performance at the festival participants will not be required to purchase a ticket however any parents/friends/relatives wishing to watch the concert will need to purchase a ticket at a limited release of heavily discounted tickets. Details to be offered in June 2022.

16. What if I can't attend one day?

Participants are expected to attend every day of Adelaide Guitar Festival Winter School. If you cannot attend for any reason (eg ill-health or family emergency) please let the Adelaide Guitar Festival team know as soon as possible. Missing any part of Winter School may mean you are unable to participate in the closing performance for your course. (see 20. For COVID)

17. What if a participant is running late to Winter School?

Participants are expected to be punctual to Winter School to ensure all participants get the most out of the session. However, if you are delayed for any reason please let the Adelaide Guitar Festival team know as soon as possible with an expected time of arrival.

18. If a parent/guardian is running late to collect a participant from Winter School

Parents/guardians of participants being picked up will be charged \$1.00 per minute for late pick up without prior arrangement or notification, so please do contact us immediately. Please also notify absences by 9am on the day of the due absence.

19. Media/photos

As part of the registration process participants or parents/guardians are requested to give permission for photography and videography of the participant. This may be used for marketing and promotion of the Adelaide Festival Centre, Adelaide Guitar Festival, and Adelaide Guitar Festival Winter School including online. Media may also be invited to photograph/film/ and interview participants.
